OWNER PRIVILEGES

If you are an owner with a horse(s) running at Ellerslie, here are the raceday privileges you are entitled to.

Owners with a horse(s) running

Complimentary general admission

Upon identifying yourself and your horse(s) at any one of our entrance points, your name will be checked against the owner list. [Click here to view a racecourse map.](#)

The number of general admission (GA) tickets received is based on the following:

- Outright owner = Complimentary GA for outright owner and up to five guests
- Two owners = Complimentary GA for both owners and up to four guests
- Three or more owners, including registered syndicate members = Complimentary GA for each owner plus one guest each

Please note that we offer free general admission to many of our racedays, so the above only applies on those days where a gate entry charge is applicable. [Click here to view our raceday calendar.](#)

Additional benefits

Once on course, proceed to the Raceday Office, located on the ground floor of the Ascot Stand. Here you can redeem your additional privileges, which include:

- Owners' tickets, which provide entry into The New Zealand Room (Level 5, Ascot Stand), Winning Post Bar (Ground floor, Ascot Stand) and the all-new Tote on Ascot (located beside the tie-up facilities). All rooms offer food and beverages for purchase, tote facilities and Trackside coverage however, Tote on Ascot offers the added benefit of a beverage special and a reasonably-priced food offering
- Complimentary race book
- Drink voucher, redeemable only in the pre-race hospitality area which is adjacent to the Parade Ring

Owners' tickets, race books and pre-race drink vouchers are allocated as follows:

- Outright Owner = Privileges for outright owner and up to five guests
- Two owners = Privileges for two owners and up to four guests
- Three or more owners, including registered syndicate members = Privileges for owner plus one guest

Please note that owners of horses that have been scratched are not eligible for any raceday privileges. That said, discretion may be used for any people who have travelled a long distance.

Hospitality and Dress Code

We offer a variety of dining and hospitality options on racedays. To see what is available on each raceday, [click here to view our event calendar](#).

A [dress code](#) is enforced in the Ascot Stand and Tote on Ascot, and many other areas on course, including hospitality precincts. The following is applicable to owners:

- Smart Casual – No shorts, singlets, jandals or collarless shirts. Denim is discouraged and not permitted in many areas on course so if you hold tickets to other areas, please ensure you and your guests are aware of this.

Most people will be in raceday attire i.e. suits or blazers, dresses etc. and a high standard of dress is encouraged, particularly on major racedays.

Pre-race hospitality

Prior to your race, you are invited to join the Club, other owners & VIP guests for a drink in the hospitality area situated adjacent to our picturesque Parade Ring.

Please ensure your owner ticket is clearly visible to the host at point of entry and that you provide bar staff your drink voucher for redemption.

Post-race

The winning owners of each race are invited to make their way immediately to the Birdcage following its running where they will have the opportunity to have a photo taken with their horse.

They will then be invited into the Winners Circle where they, along with Auckland Racing Club representative(s), can celebrate their success.

If you are not able to join us in person, a Skype facility is available in the Winners Circle to enable you to enjoy the celebration from afar. If you would like to use Skype, please contact the Club prior to the raceday - either directly or via your trainer or authorised representative.

Health and Safety

In line with the Health and Safety at Work Act 2015, we have reconfigured our Birdcage. We request that only owners of the winning horse enter the restricted Birdcage area after their

race, and for your own safety, please respect and adhere to any directives from Club officials or Stewards.
